

Each machine has a hidden code written on the information card next to the model.


Collect all the secret codes and show them to the museum staff at the Visitor Centre to receive your inventor's sticker.

Sometimes other business men would seek to steal these ideas to use themselves. This was called industrial espionage.


When the inventors were working on a new idea, it was kept secret so that no-one else could steal the idea and make money from it first.
